



After seven years at Nenana, Dixie was transferred by the Northern Commercial Company to Bethel in 1929.

Conversation about life at Bethel, then on to Fairbanks in 1933. Esther tells how Dix was clerk of the court in Fairbanks for many years, then retired, they moved to Circle Hot Springs.

Conversation goes back to Juneau-Douglas; life, costs, commodities. Back to Fairbanks, talk about Russians' buying in World War II.

Conversation turns then to Bethel, the children who visited in their home, attitudes of people in the 1930's, philosophy of missionaries, church influences on remote areas.

Esther tells about taking a boy to the states to go to school for a year and attitudes toward the trip.
