Charley quit school in the winter of 1905. Went to work for a meat store delivering meat. Summer time he herded cattle.

Pacific Cold Storage bought up a cold storage boat called the "Lottie Tablet". It sank next spring when ice went out.

Slaughter houses in very early days of Fairbanks: one on Birch Hill; Bentley dairy area; another where N.C. Cat is located now; another where GVEA is now; a cold storage and slaughter house below town.

Waechter Brothers bought Pacific Cold Storage. Creamer worked for Waechters for about three years.

Dairy Business: Hinkley ran a dairy in Fairbanks (so did couple others in early days). Mrs. Charley Creamer and Mrs. Hinkley were sisters. Hinkleys began dairy business in Alaska in 1903. In 1928 Charley bought Hinkleys out. Charles and Belle Hinkley. But before that in 1920 Charley left Fairbanks and went to Portland and went into chicken business. He married Anna Creamer that year. She was divorced from Golden who had Golden's store in Fairbanks. One son, Donald, was born at their home near Portland. Charley says the Hinkleys brought their dairy herd to Nome in 1903 and up to Fairbanks in 1904. Creamers Dairy ceased operations in 1968. Sold the land for \$1,000 per acre to Cliff Burglin, Charley says.

Follows up on dairy: In 1928 he had 8 head of horses. Bought first tractor in 1934. Crops: oats and barley and broom grass. Farmed 590 acres. Milk in 1928 25¢ per quart. It was 45¢ per quart in 1968.

Charley enlisted in the Army in World War I (infantry). Got as far east as Iowa when war ended and he was discharged. Came back to Fairbanks after army in 1918 and worked for the Alaska Railroad (being built then).

Charley's father was 93 when he died. Sister Genieve was killed in New York by an automobile. Tessie died in Tacoma earlier. Camillia died in youth (ther sisters were Frances, Marion and Mattie).

Felix Pedro? Knew him and wife. Delivered milk to them at their home on Clay street. Then had no children. Charley just a kid then. Talks about Pedro, Hanot Brothers, Costa Brothrs who mined on Pedro Creek (or vicintiy).
