

Clara Rust recalls how her family went to Circle every fall. Tells about shooting a moose at Medicine Lake.

Mrs. Leach talks about meat in the early days. Lots of moose and caribou. Preserved the meat in the ice tunnel (same tunnel that root cellar was located in). She tells about making ice all winter so it would be stored in ice compartment in the tunnel for summer time use and for preservation of food in warmer months. She made butter that was used at the springs, too.

Recalls the 1930's when both Charlotte Ames and Ruth Olson worked at the hotel. Music was provided Saturday nights by Charlotte on the piano. First year Charlotte was there (1934) Dorie Walner came over to the springs and worked for her room and board (while she was getting a divorce from her husband). She played the banjo. Next year Herb McCarty who worked at the springs, played, his instruments being the clarinet and saxophone. Then Earl Blinzler (did barbering, repair work at the springs) came and played the sax for two years.
