He then went down to British Columbia in 1899 and stayed there a year. He went into the Forty-mile district in 1900 and then went into Fairbanks. His father died about ten years ago. James worked for the NC Company and also worked in mining. James said everyone worked in mining. He said he had a wonderful life. James talked about Mr. Berkid and expressed that he was a fine man. He compared him to Calvin Coolidge.

Julian A. Hurley was born on April 1, 1885 in Oregon. He studied law and came to Alaska in 1922. He was appointed as the assistant United States attorney in Anchorage. There were only a few other attorneys in Anchorage at the time he arrived in Alaska. They took the census when he was in Anchorage and there were only 1200 people in the area. Mrs. Hurley talked about how Julian was offered a position in Fairbanks. She didn't want to move there because of the extremely cold temperatures. They moved to Fairbanks in 1924 after two years in Anchorage. Julian talked about the oldest attorney in Alaska.
