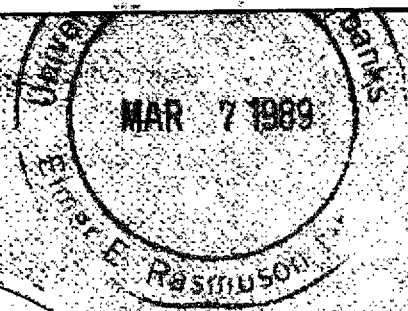

Robert W. Sarnoff

Born in New York City, Robert W. Sarnoff graduated from Harvard University in 1939 and studied law at Columbia University. After government service in the Office of the Coordinator of Information, he joined the Cowles publications and broadcasting enterprises in Des Moines, Iowa, and New York City. In 1948 he joined the National Broadcasting Company and five years later became a director of the company. He served as president of NBC from 1955 to 1958, chief executive officer from 1956 to 1966, and chairman of the board of directors from 1958 to 1966.

Under Mr. Sarnoff's direction NBC made television broadcasting history with such programs as "Continental Classroom," "NBC Opera," and the noted "Victory at Sea" series portraying naval operations during World War II.

Mr. Sarnoff served as president of the RCA Corporation from 1966 to 1971 and is presently chief executive officer and chairman of its board of directors.

His 26 years of leadership in broadcasting and communications, first with NBC and now with RCA, have been marked by many innovations and many significant advances in electronic technology. Under his guidance RCA has developed the power supply and communications for the Apollo lunar missions, including the spectacularly successful color television camera on Lunar Rover. In 1973 RCA's unmanned space satellites for weather observations sent back to earth their two-millionth picture. RCA is providing the communications system aboard the Viking Lander spacecraft, scheduled to land on Mars in 1976.

Three years ago Mr. Sarnoff authorized RCA's purchase of the Air Force's Alaska telecommunications network and the establishment of RCA Alascom, providing satellite circuits for domestic and global telephone service, microwave links among the principal Alaska cities, and automatic direct long-distance dialing.

William Randolph Hearst, Jr.

Born in New York City, William Randolph Hearst, Jr., has spent most of his life in that great metropolis. After attending the University of California he returned to his home city to begin his distinguished career as a journalist and publisher. From his first position as a reporter for the *New York American* in 1928 he advanced through the ranks to become publisher of the paper in 1937. He published the *Journal-American* from 1937 until 1956, taking time out to serve as a war correspondent from 1943 to 1945.

Now chairman, vice president, and director of the Hearst Corporation, whose nationwide chain includes three West Coast newspapers familiar to Alaskans — the *Los Angeles Herald-Examiner*, the *San Francisco Examiner*, and the *Seattle Post-Intelligencer* — William Randolph Hearst, Jr., is also a director of 20th Century Fox, of United Press International, and of the San Luis Mining Company. For his excellence in journalism he was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in 1956 and the Overseas Press Award in 1958.

When Alaska, in the early 1950s, was making its early gestures toward statehood, William Randolph Hearst, Jr., joined the cause. Throughout the upward struggle, until statehood was achieved in 1959, the strong support voiced by the Hearst newspapers across the country was of inestimable help toward its attainment.

More recently his strong support for the construction of the Prudhoe Bay-Valdez Pipeline helped immeasurably in convincing the American public of the necessity of the line and in lessening fears in regard to its effect on the environment.

Howard Rock

The son of an Eskimo whaling captain, Howard Rock early learned the traditional skills of the hunter. But the desire to develop his considerable artistic talents led him from the village of his birth into the broader world where he became a recognized artist. When the winds of change began blowing in the North, he put aside his art and took up the pen to tell the nation and world of the inequities suffered by his people, and of their hopes for a better life.

At the age of 14 he left the family home at Point Hope for the government school at White Mountain. There a teacher encouraged him to paint and, recognizing his great potential, arranged for him to study under an accomplished artist in Oregon upon his graduation from high school. He went on to the University of Washington for formal training and then began a career in Seattle handcrafting art objects, a career that continued until 1961, interrupted only by World War II, in which he served as a radio operator in North Africa with the U.S. Army Air Force.

During a visit to Point Hope in 1961, he learned of the villagers' concern over proposed nuclear experiments in the area and assisted them in writing letters of protest. The need for a continuing publication to present the native people's views on this and other developments incompatible with their best interests was impressed upon him by friends. When financing was offered for such a publication, on condition that he become its editor, he accepted the challenge. On October 1, 1962, the *Tundra Times* was born.

Few publications have had the impact of that newspaper, with its unique perspective. Through it, he encouraged the political organization of the native people and pressed continuously for settlement of their long-standing land claims, a goal finally achieved in 1971. Friendly persuasion rather than militancy has marked his journalistic efforts and won for him high honors and great respect.

Academic Dress

THE HISTORY OF ACADEMIC DRESS reaches far back into the early days of the oldest universities. It appears that academic clothing was first introduced and worn at Oxford and Cambridge universities in England in the thirteenth century. Various modifications were soon introduced, resulting in great diversity in color and style of cap, gown, and hood worn at different institutions.

The European custom was carried to America with the establishment of our own colleges and universities. In 1895, an academic code of dress was adopted and the standards accepted by most of the colleges and universities in the United States. Today the black cap, gown, and hood are generally worn. The following description explains dress worn at the University of Alaska:

Cap — The Oxford cap, the so-called mortarboard, is black and has a long tassel fastened to the middle of the top that is usually worn pendant over the left front of the cap. At many institutions colored tassels are worn to indicate the candidate's school or college. Here the black tassel is worn on the cap for all baccalaureate and master's degrees, and gold tassels are worn for all doctor's degrees.

Gown — Three types of black gowns may be distinguished here in the academic procession. The baccalaureate gowns have long, pointed sleeves. The master's gowns have oblong sleeves with an arc cut away in the front. The doctor's gowns are faced with velvet and have bell-shaped sleeves with three bars of velvet.

Hood — Here candidates for master's and doctor's degrees wear hoods with velvet trim which indicates the degree that the candidate has earned: Master of Arts, white; Master of Business Administration, drab; Master of Education, light blue; Master of Engineering, orange; Master of Fine Arts, brown; Master of Science, yellow; and Doctor of Philosophy, dark blue. The lining of the hood in every case is blue and gold, the colors of the University.

Gold Cord — At the University of Alaska, graduating seniors with high scholastic standing are singled out for special recognition during commencement exercises. A gold cord is worn over the shoulders of each graduating senior with a 3.5 or higher (out of a possible 4.0) cumulative grade point average.
