[Someone seems to be dictating letters on tape. Recording quality is quite bad.] The letter begins: Dear Arthur Jones [?], Fairbanks. The writer of the letter says that they didn't receive Jones' report from 1964 or 1966. They'd like to discuss [unclear]. Richard [unclear], was newly appointed to the position of the Director of [unclear] State Refineries. He worked at the Oregon State refineries. The letter also writes about basic archives and their main responsibilities, and is talking about state archives. Somebody was impressed by the material that the writer of the letter showed Jones, about North Carolina Department of [unclear] Industry. They'd like to receive copies of [unclear]. If Mr. Jones would be willing to send copies, the sender of the letter would be very grateful. Then there is the address for the Director of State Libraries in Juneau, Alaska.

5:43 Letter no. 2 is addressed for Miss [unclear] Fairbanks in Seattle, Washington. The writer addresses Miss Fairbanks and thanks for her letter on January 29th and that they were very happy that she was able to join the index to the records of the Northern Commercial Company and thanks for the suggestion to contact a subject of a picture, Captain Klingenberg [sp?]. They'll do that soon. They'd like to [unclear] in 1889-1888 [unclear].

At 7:27 is the letter no. 3: It's addressed to Mr. [unclear] Toten [sp?]. The letter thanks Mr. Toten for his letter in January 22nd. [Unclear.] The writer has sent copies of Mr. Toten's letter regarding the burial site to Dr. Bennet Brikovsky [sp?], an archeologist at the anthropology department, and to Dr. [unclear], director of the University Museum. [Unclear.] The writer would suggest [unclear] contact you as soon as possible. Again, they are very delighted [unclear] magazine and are pleased to know that Mr. Toten is enjoying his retirement. [Unclear]

Next letter is for Reverend [Robert?] Karns. The letter addresses dear Reverend Karns. [Break in the recording.]
