Dear Robyn,

I am enclosing the release agreement for the tape which I sent you some time ago and I trust it may be of interest for the Oral History Collection. The interview took place in my parents' apartment in the Heartstone Retirement Home in Seattle in the summer of 1976. Dad was born in Juneau, Alaska on Aug 7, 1896 and died in Seattle on Sept 25, 1976.

My father did not really start a manuscript for a book on mining in Alaska although we often speak of material that might be included. Copies of one of the papers he wrote and used in U. of A. mining courses and reports he prepared for the F. E. Company are available but I don't know if he ever intended to include anything so technical.

As I seem to be the family historian I have a small collection of photos and memorabilia, some of which are displayed in my home or in the family cabin which Dad bequeathed to me and my sister. I gather the University is interested in the original documents. If I find duplicate photos I shall put them aside for the Archives.

Regarding the Waterfront Brown story, I'm sorry to say I cannot be helpful. As I listened intently to the tape I realized that it was not Dad who started the story. I think the interviewer asked him if he knew Waterfront Brown and soon after a voice other than my father began to speak. It sounded like Paul Lien so recall Dad telling about a baseball trip to Renona, however.
