

D: Yeah, we stayed in Harriet Hess Hall..... The army had its own cook and everything there. There was only about six or eight girls goin' to college when we were there..... We did all the KP and kitchen work.....

C: *What kind of maneuvers did they have you doing at the University?*

D: Just a little training.(Old Main) was empty then. When I got into the infantry out there at Ladd Field, they took us out there to help clean the thing out. They was getting ready to demolish it.....

C: *Did you find anything interesting?*

D: The guys found some of that alcohol, pure grain alcohol..... (*Looking at Terrance Cole's "The Cornerstone on College Hill"*) We sure have lived in interesting times.
