Ethel Faye Stoneman was interviewed by Karen Brewster on June 18 and 26, July 2, 9, and 19, 2015 at her home in North Pole, Alaska for the Hospice Legacy Video Project provided by Hospice Services of Fairbanks Memorial Hospital, Fairbanks, Alaska. Ethel's niece, Renae Byrd was also present during the interviews and assisted by either bringing up topics for discussion or providing Ethel with visual aids, such as photographs, newspaper articles, and other memorabilia. Karen Callahan, Volunteer Coordinator at Hospice Services was also present at a couple of the early interviews, but mostly did not say anything.

Ethel passed away on September 7, 2015.

Ethel's sons Darwon and Frank, as well as her niece Renae, have copies of the video recordings.

In these interviews, Ethel talks about ^{her childhood &} growing up on a farm in rural Colorado, working as a teacher in Colorado, coming to Alaska & settling in North Pole with her husband, Glenn Stoneman.

She talks about working at the telephone company & bus utilities & the credit union on Fort Wainwright, & running a lodge at Scottie Creek. She talks about

the early days of North pole, homesteading, ^[cruising] ^[travelling] & family, ^{dog mushing} & the 1967 Flood.

Ethel was active in Ice Alaska & talks about this & her other volunteer activities such as Santa's Senior, Samaritan Counselor, & North Star Council on Aging.
