Talked about fur robes. Hanson bought a bear robe from Martin Pinska store in Fairbanks in 1914. He still uses it for sleeping robe in his Tofty camp. He paid \$200 or \$250 for it.

Bob notes that there are four generations of oldest sons in his family: his father, himself, his son and his grandson.

Only oldtimer Hanson knows who still lives in Manley is Archie Pringle.

Any serious accidents during his 60 years at Tofty? None except broken knee cap in 1916. Went to Ft. Gibbon (Tanana) for induction in Army for World A War I and doctor refused him because of bad knee cap. The knee healed itself in time and no problems. Health now is good. Sore elbow sometimes. Recalls that there was a doctor at Woodchopper for about year and half during height of population there, but after the camp reduced no other doctors were in the area.

Talk briefly about the F.E. power plant coming down in Fairbanks. Also talk about the new hotel in Fairbanks (Chena View) that was erected right where the old Pioneer Hotel was located.
